TIME	LESSON OUTLINE	AID CUES
About 20- 30 minutes	Educate: The purpose of the Wisconsin Boat Safety Training Program is to promote SAFE, RESPONSIBLE, and ETHICAL (a personal code of conduct) boat operation. Instruction emphasizes the importance of laws and regulations, ethics, personal safety, and the proper operation of boats. By participating in the program, students will obtain a better understanding of their obligations to their passengers, themselves, other boaters, and to the waterway they are operating on. Chapter 5 in the Student Manual introduces the students to the RISKS involved in boating and the ways these risks can be reduced. Ask the students how long they have been boating and the type of boat they normally ride in or are going to be	Student Manual Ch. 5

	1. Always wear an approved PFD.	Have students fill in blank

	4. Know your limitations and your boat's limitations.	
	5. Don't sit or allow your passengers to sit on the gunwales, bow, or seat backs while underway.

	9. Be aware of shallow water areas and submerged objects prior to going out.	
	Demonstrate/Observe:	
	Read four or five of the fatal summaries and ask the students to discuss which safety rule(s) were violated. They will begin to see a pattern.	
	Congratulate: the students for their answers and for their active participation in the exercise.	
	Remind that students that the program is supposed to be informative and fun but SAFETY is the primary lesson to be learned.	
	Encourage students to continue to participate in classroom discussion.
