	O-Observe: (optional)	
	Instructor will set up a short trail with signs along the way. Instructor will walk the trail with a student or small group of students, having students explain how they would operate in the vicinity of the sign and the importance of each sign. Two examples of signs to use on a trail are below: Trail marker – trail directional blaze – stop ahead – stop – stay on trail – route arrow
