Rock climbing is considered a traditional recreational activity that may occur on department lands (NR 1.33, Wis. Admin. Code). Bouldering and scrambling, types of rock climbing generally performed without the use of equipment, are allowed on all department lands unless posted closed to all public access. Rock climbing with equipment (e.g., cams, nuts, carabiners, anchors, ropes, etc.) may occur in non-designated use areas on most department lands unless posted closed, except for State Natural Areas where it is allowed only under specific circumstances as provided for in NR 45.13(1)(e), Wis. Admin. Code.
