0:00 ↓ 10:00 ↓	<p><u>E-EDUCATE</u></p> <p><u>Background:</u> When riding your snowmobile you will encounter trail signs. They are designed to communicate information about the trail. It's important to familiarize yourself with common trail signs.</p> <p><u>D-DEMONSTRATE</u> Each instructor will have a sign set poster and will show each sign and explain what they are for and their importance. -----time and class size permitting-----</p> <p><u>O-OBSERVE</u> Instructor will set up a short trail and signs along the way. Instructor will walk the trail with a student or small group of students, having students explain how they would operate in the vicinity of the sign and the importance of each sign. Two examples of signs to use</p>	1 sign set and 1 large sign poster

 20:00	<p>on a trail are below:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Trail marker-trail directional blaze-stop ahead-stop-stay on trail-route arrow. 2. Yield-route sign-speed limit-directional blaze-tee intersection-restriction (no snowmobile's). <p><u>C-CONGRATULATE</u></p> <p>Congratulate your students for doing a great job and understanding the importance of obeying snowmobile trail signs.</p>
