SUMMARY:

Per s.23.0916(2) Wis. Stats., and consistent with s. NR52.05 Wis. Adm. Code, the Board must determine that the prohibition of hunting is necessary to protect public safety on the 2.37 acres in the City of Schofield, Marathon County.

The Department has made the determination that prohibition of hunting is necessary to protect public safety due to:

- Proximity to residential buildings.
- · Proximity to a school.
- · City ordinance prohibitions

The property will provide opportunities for passive recreation such as hiking, picnicking, nature enjoyment, fishing, cross-country skiing, trapping, and snowshoeing.

RECOMMENDATION: Approve the Department's determination that the prohibition of hunting is necessary to protect public safety on 2.37 acres to be acquired by the City of Schofield, Marathon County.

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SUBJECT: Request approval for the prohibition of nature-based outdoor activities – City of Schofield,

Marathon County

In accordance with s. 23.0916(2) Wis. Stats., the Department requests that the Board approve the prohibition of one nature-based outdoor activity on 2.37-acres of land in the City of Schofield, Marathon County. The Department proposes to award a Knowles-Nelson Stewardship grant to the City of Schofield for the purchase of land on which hunting will be prohibited by local ordinance and state hunting laws.

I. PROJECT DETAILS

Project Sponsor: City of Schofield
Sellers: Grand Commerce LLC
Urban Green Space

Project description: The 2.37-acre parcel is a vacant waterfront parcel zoned for commercial use with frontage on Lake Wausau on the east, commercial buildings on the west, City owned land on the north and residential housing to the south. The property will be an expansion to an existing City park. Maps are attached as Appendix A

Current/prior use of property: There is no public use currently. The 2.37-acres is part of one private commercial lot which was once a site with two commercial buildings. Since 2011, all buildings have been removed.

Proposed public uses: The planned use for the 2.37-acre property is to expand an existing City park along Lake Wausau and eventually develop it for a boat launch facility. The property includes approximately 1,380 feet of frontage, including a unique bay and peninsula along Lake Wausau which connects to both the Wisconsin River and Eau Claire River.

Public recreation opportunities on the 2.37-acre subject include fishing, trapping, hiking, cross-county skiing, picnicking and scenic enjoyment. The Department's analysis of the permitted nature-based outdoor activities is attached in Appendix B.

Property management: The property will be operated and maintained by City of Schofield, Parks and Public Works Departments.

II. NBOA DETERMINATION

Nature-based outdoor activities (NBOAs) are defined in s. NR 52.02(7), Wis. Adm. Code, as hunting, trapping, fishing, hiking, or cross-country skiing. The City of Schofield proposes to prohibit hunting, on the 2.37 property acquisition. The Regional Public Safety Team, Jacob Holsclaw, Safety Specialist Warden, Richard Rosen Regional Warden, and Cheryl Housley, Project Manager, determined that the prohibition of this activity is necessary to protect public safety. This determination is based the following

factors:


- The primary purpose of the project (boat access and City park land);
- > City ordinances prohibiting discharge of firearms;
- Proximity to residential homes and schools;
- > State of Wisconsin hunting laws


State law prohibits the discharge of a firearm within 300 feet of any building devoted to human occupancy while on lands that you do not own, without the permission of the owner or occupant. State law also restricts both the possession and the discharge of firearms within 1,000 feet of school grounds as well as the hunting within 1,700 feet of any school grounds. The southern and central portion of the 2.37-acre property is within 100 yards of buildings devoted to human occupancy. There is an apartment complex to the south of the property. Immediately to the north is a bank and city owned building.

The Department posted public notice about this determination on GovDelivery on November 3, 2021. Two comments were received; one in support, and one inquiring about parcel location and acknowledging logic in Department staff's determination of the prohibition of hunting. In addition, Marathon County Parks Commission, passed a resolution of support of the acquisition. The public notice and comment summary submitted may be found in Appendix C and D attached to this Green Sheet.

FINDINGS OF FACT:			
Recreation Warden Holsclaw visited the site on 10-26-21. Met with City of Schofield Public Works director/Zoning Administrator Mark Thuot and Cheryl Housley with DNR Stewardship Grants. Several facts should be noted in regard to hunting restrictions.			
The southern and central portion of the property is within 100 yards of buildings devoted to human occupancy. There is an apartment complex to the south of the property. Immediately to the north is a bank and city owned building. The area that could potentially be hunted is extremely small. Waterfowl could be hunted with a bow on the extreme west side of the peninsula and be beyond the 100-yard restriction.			
The property is entirely within the 1700-foot restriction from a school for firearm use. There is approximately 1500 feet from the farthest northern portion of the property to the closest point of the school building to the south. This would prohibit firearm discharge.			
I see no issues with trapping as long as state law is follow within 100-yard distance from buildings.	ved, and traps of specified size a	re restricted to underwater use	

Parcel Size, Shape, and Topography: Describe the size, shape, and topography of the parcel and how it relates to public safety for this activity on this site.

The subject property consists of 2.37 acres of vacant land that is level, open and irregular in shape, including a peninsula that extends westerly from the main shore and extends south creating a small, protected bay. The peninsula and the northern portion of the property is forested with various hardwood species while the remaining area includes an old concrete slab. The western boundary of the property is Lake Wausau. There were several buildings that formerly occupied the site, but in 2010, all of the buildings were removed and the land has been vacant since. To the east and south are several, occupied commercial buildings as well Grand Ave (Bus. Hwy 51) lies to the east.

CITY OF SCHOFIELD SEEKS URBAN GREEN SPACE GRANT FOR LAND ACQUISITION

SCHOFIELD, Wis. – The Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources (DNR) today announced that the City of Schofield has applied for a 50% matching grant from the Urban Green Space subprogram of the Knowles-Nelson Stewardship Program to assist with the purchase of 2,37 acres of land in the City of Schofield in Marathon County. The City will provide the matching funds to the grant award.

The City of Schofield will acquire approximately 2.37 acres to expand an existing City park along Lake Wausau and eventually develop it for a boat launch facility. The property includes approximately 1,380 feet of frontage, including a unique bay and peninsula along Lake Wausau that connects to the Wisconsin River and Eau Claire River. Recreational activities will include fishing, trapping, hiking, cross-country skiing, picnicking and scenic enjoyment.

The DNR has examined the property's locational factors and is determining that the prohibition of hunting is necessary to protect public safety because of the parcel's proximity to residential dwellings and a school.

The Knowles-Nelson Stewardship Fund was created in 1989 to preserve important natural resources, protect water quality and fisheries and expand opportunities for outdoor recreation for all Wisconsinites to enjoy.

On Stewardship-purchased land, nature-based outdoor activities cannot be prohibited unless the DNR has determined that prohibiting one or more of those activities is justified to protect public safety.


