



Overview of SAG

 Potentially invasive plants that are not common in trade but may pose threats ecologically, economically, or otherwise if introduced.



Changes to Currently Regulated Species

Japanese hedgeparsley (Torilis japonica)

- Current Regulatory Status:
 Split-listed
- Proposed Regulatory Status:
 Restricted
- Justification:
 - Widespread across the state



Changes to Currently Regulated Species

Wild chervil (Anthriscus sylvestris)

- Current Regulatory Status:
 Split-listed
- Proposed Regulatory Status:
 Restricted
- Justification:
 - Widespread across the state



Newly Proposed for Regulation

Downy alpine grass (Avenula pubescens)

- Proposed Regulatory Status: Prohibited
- Justification:
 - Evidence for impacts to natural areas and agronomic industry
 - No socio-economic value
 - Present in the state and likely to spread



Newly Proposed for Regulation

Indian pokeweed (Phytolacca acinosa)

- Proposed Regulatory Status:
 Prohibited
- Justification:
 - Few populations in the state
 - Potential for control
 - Human health hazard poisonous



Newly Proposed for Regulation

Puncturevine (Tribulus terrestris)

- Proposed Regulatory Status: Prohibited
- Justification:
 - Human and other mammal hazard
 - Likely to increase with climate change
 - Control/mitigation is possible
