	Gloves: A good pair of gloves protect your hands from the cold. For best protection, choose gloves with: 1. Padding to protect your knuckles. 2. Gauntlets to prevent cold air from entering your sleeves.	Gloves
	Boots: Heels prevent your feet from slipping off the footrests. Snowmobile type boots protect the feet, ankles and lower legs. Some boots have removable liners for quicker drying.	Boots
	Clothing: The proper clothing protects you from scratches and extremes of the weather. The ideal winter outfit for snowmobile riders is a snowmobile suit. In addition to keeping you warm, a snow suit may keep you afloat for several minutes if submerged in water.	Different jackets/ Snowmobile suits PFD jackets Snow pants
	Dressing for Cold Weather: Wind chill factor will have an affect on exposed skin at different speeds and air temperatures. Dressing in layers offers insulation and provides the best protection during winter riding.	Snowmobile manual.
	O-OBSERVE Students demonstrate using a junior instructor or volunteer, have them dress in minimal suggested clothing (helmet, goggles, jacket, pants, gloves, boots). Ask students why each piece of clothing is important to safe snowmobile riding.
