SUMMARY:

The department is requesting approval to accept the following two donations located within project boundaries under authority provided in s. 23.09(2)(d), Wis. Stats., and s. NR 1.41(1)(e), Wis. Admin. Code, which will provide opportunities for public recreation and will be open to the public for all five nature-based outdoor recreational activities to include hunting, fishing, trapping, hiking and cross-country skiing.

1. Devil's Lake State Park

A donation of 80 acres of land from The Nature Conservancy (TNC) that lies within the Devil's Lake State Park project boundary and abuts department-owned lands to the north, west and east and the Ho-Chunk Nation-owned portion of the Sauk Prairie State Recreation Area (former Badger Army Ammunition Plant) to the south. The property will be accessible to the public through the adjacent department-owned lands. With this proposed donation and the recent acquisition of the parcel to the west, this portion of Devil's Lake State Park, also known as the South Bluff/Devil's Nose State Natural Area, will be fully acquired.

Devil's Lake State Park is one of the most scenic and visited parks in the State, with approximately 2.7 million + visitors per year. The addition of this parcel will create a contiguous corridor of public lands in this portion of the Baraboo Hills. This property is suited for a variety of recreational opportunities and could be developed with amenities such as hiking and mountain bicycling trails. Devil's Lake State Park is currently going through the master planning process and, if accepted, this property would be included in that planning effort. The department recommends acceptance of this property to provide more recreational lands in the most visited department property, as well as improved public and department access and management by acquiring this inholding in the project area.

2. Glacial Habitat Restoration Area

A donation of 171.82 acres of land from Wetlands America Trust, Inc. that lies within the Glacial Habitat Restoration Area (GHRA) project boundary. The subject property consists of rolling topography with glacial ridges of northern hardwood timber, wetland bottoms, and approximately 4,600' of frontage on the northwest shore of Rush Lake, a well-known and popular waterfowl viewing and hunting area. Recent Ducks Unlimited management activities include restoration of native prairie, oak savanna and wetlands, and installation of a designated parking area in the northwest corner, at an overall cost of \$100,000. The property will also provide access to a 20.5-acre property landlocked since 2012.

The GHRA was established in 1990 to restore 38,600 acres of grassland and 11,000 acres of wetlands to increase populations of ring-necked pheasants, waterfowl, and grassland songbirds in 24 townships in Columbia, Dodge, Fond du Lac and Winnebago Counties. The project uses a landscape scale approach to habitat management that incorporates a mosaic of wetland and grasslands with cropland to create habitat conditions more favorable for self-sustaining wildlife populations in the glacial moraines of east central Wisconsin.

RECOMMENDATION: That the Board accept the two donations: 1. 80 acres of land for Devil's Lake State Park; and 2. 171.82 acres for the Glacial Habitat Restoration Area. That a certificate of appreciation be sent to the landowners, and that an expression of appreciation be made a part of the official records of the Natural Resources Board. 2. <u>JUSTIFICATION</u>:

The department is requesting approval to accept a donation of 80 acres of land from The Nature Conservancy, a District of Columbia nonprofit corporation (TNC), that lies within the Devil's Lake State Park project boundary and abuts department-owned lands to the north, west and east and the Ho-Chunk Nation-owned portion of the Sauk Prairie State Recreation Area (former Badger Army Ammunition Plant) to the south, under authority provided in s. 23.09(2)(d), Wis. Stats., and s. NR 1.41(1)(e), Wis. Admin. Code. The property will be accessible to the public through the adjacent department-owned lands and will provide opportunities for public recreation.



The subject property is an 80-acre inholding comprised of upland woodland and steeply sloping topography. This property is suited for a variety of recreational opportunities including hunting and wildlife watching and could be developed with amenities such as hiking and mountain biking trails. Devil's Lake State Park is currently going through the master planning process as part of the Central Sand Hills ecological landscape and, if accepted, this property would be included in that planning effort. With the acceptance of this donation and the recent acquisition of the parcel to the west, this portion of Devil's Lake State Park, also known as the South Bluff/Devil's Nose State Natural Area, will be fully acquired and accessible for public recreation.

Devil's Lake State Park is one of the most scenic and visited parks in the State, with more than 2.7 million visitors per year. Acceptance of this parcel will create a contiguous corridor of public lands in this portion of the Baraboo Hills and will provide additional land for outdoor recreation opportunities including all five nature-based outdoor activities.

The department recommends acceptance of this donation of land to provide more recreational lands in the most visited department property, as well as improved public and department access and management by acquiring this inholding in the project area.

3. <u>LAND MANAGEMENT</u>:

The property abuts department-owned land to the north, east and west and will be managed as part of the Devil's Lake State Park by department staff. The Central Sand Hills Regional Master Plan is currently in process and Devil's Lake State Park is part of this plan. This property would be included in this planning process.

2. <u>JUSTIFICATION</u>:

The department is requesting approval to accept a donation of 171.82 acres of land from Wetlands America Trust, Inc. (a fiduciary agent of Ducks Unlimited) that lies within the Glacial Habitat Restoration Area (GHRA) project boundary in Winnebago County under authority provided in s. 23.09(2)(d), Wis. Stats., and s. NR 1.41(1)(e), Wis. Admin. Code. The subject property consists of rolling topography with glacial ridges of northern hardwood timber, wetland bottoms, and approximately 4,600' of frontage on the northwest shore of Rush Lake, a well-known and popular waterfowl viewing and hunting area. The property will also provide access to a 20.5-acre department-owned property landlocked since 2012.



Wetlands America Trust, Inc. (WAT) purchased the property using a combination of NRDA funds and a Knowles Nelson Stewardship grant. Recent Ducks Unlimited management activities include restoration of native prairie, oak savanna and wetlands, including creating various smaller inland ponds, as well as a designated parking area in the northwest corner, at an overall cost of \$100,000. Infrastructure improvements include two water control structures manufactured by Agri-Drain that are approximately 20"x24" with inlet and outlet PVC pipes located on an abandoned railroad grade to act as a berm or dike. Before ownership transfer, WAT will be removing a 12' by 24'dilapidated wood structured cabin located in the southeast portion of the property.

The GHRA was established in 1990 to restore 38,600 acres of grassland and 11,000 acres of wetlands to increase populations of ring-necked pheasants, waterfowl, and grassland songbirds in 24 townships in Columbia, Dodge, Fond du Lac and Winnebago Counties. The project uses a landscape scale approach to habitat management that incorporates a mosaic of wetland and grasslands with cropland to create habitat conditions more favorable for self-sustaining wildlife populations in the glacial moraines of east central Wisconsin.

The department recommends acceptance of this donation of land to allow for continued public access supporting recreational activities in the Glacial Habitat Restoration Area.

3. <u>LAND MANAGEMENT</u>:

This property will be managed in conjunction with the surrounding GHRA property. Habitat management will be completed by staff in the Wildlife Management program. Approximately \$100,000 and 200 volunteer hours has already been spent by Ducks Unlimited on prairie, savanna, and wetland restorations on the property. Ducks Unlimited plans to maintain a strong presence on the land in support of department management plans. Habitat management in the future will consist primarily of maintenance of these restorations through the use of mowing, prescribed burning, occasional herbicide treatments, and wetland infrastructure upkeep. Ducks Unlimited plans to maintain a strong presence on the land in support of department management plans.





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
