TIME	LESSON OUTLINE	AID CUES
Depending on group size 15-30 minutes	Purpose of the lesson:	
	The purpose of the lesson is to show students the affects alcohol/drugs will have on a person. Then, relate what they have learned to the operation of a Boat/ATV/snowmobile.	
	Educate:	
	Know the law:	
	No person can operate a Boat/ATV/Snowmobile while under the influence of an intoxicant to a degree, which renders him or her incapable of safe operation and no person is allowed to operate a Boat/ATV/Snowmobile while the person has an alcohol concentration of 0.08 or more.	
	Causing Injury:	
	You can cause injury or death to a person if you're intoxicated. If this happens, the penalties are much more severe, such as high fines and possibly going to prison. It is important to know: Alcohol and drugs slow your reflexes, affects how you see, your sense of balance, your judgment, and gives you a feeling of being warm when you are not.

TIME	LESSON OUTLINE	AID CUES
	Maintain adult supervision at all times. Instructors shall closely monitor the students to steady them in case they become unbalanced. If students begin to engage in horseplay, discontinue the activity.	
	Demonstrate	
	Prior to putting on the drunk buster goggles an Instructor will demonstrate the following:	
	While sitting or standing an instructor will (catch a ball, retrieving coins from ice water or walk a masking tape line) without the drunk buster goggles.	
	(this is done to show how easy it is to do without the physical impairment of the drunk goggles)	
	NEXT - the Instructor demonstrates what they just did while wearing the drunk buster goggles:	
	** Instructor need to exercise caution while demonstrating and allowing students to participate in this exercise.	
	Observe:	
	Ask for 2 or 3 student volunteers and do what the Instructor demonstrated above. Repeat with other students if there is time available.	
	Congratulate:	
	Congratulate students for participating in activity.
