F. Request approval of the proposed Rib Mountain State Park Master Plan Revision (Phil Rynish, Property Planning Section Chief)

At 4:43:26 Terry Hilgenberg MOVED, seconded by Dr. Frederick Prehn approval of the department's recommendation.

At 4:44:48 Dr. Frederick Prehn MOVED to amend the motion to modify the Master Plan for Management Area 5 and to add additional management objectives and prescriptions to Area 2. The amendment shall read:

Amend Land Management Classification Maps F1 and F2 to show Area 5 expanded to approximately 54 acres as shown on the white area on the Amendment Map with an additional 9 acres within Area 2 that may be included in the ski area lease area. This would result in a total of 63 acres that may be included in a western lease area expansion.

Allow for a ski lift within Area 5 that is designed to traverse Area 2: Talus Forest State Natural Area, without including any construction, such as lift towers or pylons, and with minimal impacts to Area 2.

Add the following to Public Use and Recreation Objectives for Area 2 (page 30):

Provide limited downhill skiing opportunities in the area on the north side of the mountain.

Add the following prescription to the Public Use and Recreation Prescriptions for Area 2: Talus Forest State Natural Area (page 30):

Allow a portion of the area on the north side of the mountain (no more than 10 acres) to be included in a potential western ski area lease expansion with language ensuring minimal impacts to natural area vegetation, geology, and ecology, as shown on the amendment map. Allow minimal ski infrastructure with up to three lightly-developed ski trails allowed to cross through the area.

The ski lift shown on the Amendment map shall pass over the top of Area 2 vegetation. Pilings, towers and similar ski lift facilities are not authorized within Area 2. Pulverizing or grading of rock is not permitted. Any required tree cutting shall be done by hand. Heavy machinery is not authorized for use within Management Area 2, and all ski infrastructure, including lighting and pipes, shall minimally impact the other objectives of the natural area. No more than three lightly-developed ski trails are authorized within Area 2.

Amend first Public Use and Recreation prescription in Area 5 to include a ski lift. The amended prescription shall read (page 36):

Construct and operate new facilities, including a new ski lift, for downhill skiing and snowboarding, snow tubing, cross-country skiing and other winter activities with an outdoor recreational focus.

If this is approved, the Department shall make any other revisions needed so that the plan language and summary is consistent with the amendment as adopted by the NRB.

At 4:48:45, after Board discussion, Dr. Prehn amended his motion, with the consent of the seconder, to add "and mountain biking lift activities" to the address use of the lift proposed in the amendment for mountain biking. The amended sentence reads:

Provide limited downhill skiing opportunities and mountain biking lift activities in the area on the north side of the mountain.
