#### SUMMARY:

Per s.23.0916(2) Wis. Stats., and consistent with s. NR52.05 Wis. Adm. Code, the Board must determine that the prohibition of hunting and trapping is necessary to protect public safety on the 0.75-acre parcel in the City of Monona, Dane County.

The Department has made the determination that prohibition of hunting and trapping is necessary to protect public safety due to:

- Proximity to residential buildings.
- · Proximity to a school.
- City ordinance prohibitions
- Urban setting and user expectation

The property will provide opportunities for passive recreation such as hiking, picnicking, nature enjoyment, fishing, cross-country skiing, and snowshoeing.

**RECOMMENDATION:** Approve the Department's determination that the prohibition of hunting and trapping is necessary to protect public safety on .75 acres to be acquired by the City of Monona, Dane County.

**SUBJECT:** Request approval for the prohibition of nature-based outdoor activities – City of Monona,

San Damiano Friary Acquisition

In accordance with s. 23.0916(2)c Wis. Stats., the Department requests the Board approve the prohibition of two nature-based outdoor activities on 0.75-acre of land in the City of Monona, Dane County. The Department proposes to award a Knowles-Nelson Stewardship grant to the City of Monona for the purchase of land on which hunting and trapping will be prohibited by local ordinances and state hunting laws.

## I. PROJECT DETAILS

**Project Sponsor:** City of Monona

**Sellers:** Norbertine Novitiate order of Praemonstratensian Fathers

(San Damiano Friary)

**Grant sub-program:** Urban Green Space

## **Project description:**

The City of Monona has applied for Stewardship funds to support a portion of the San Damiano acquisition. The proposed Stewardship grant will support the purchase of approximately .75 acres of the 9.8-acre property. The subject property includes wetland, upland areas, and 100 feet of Lake Monona shoreline. The City intends to manage the .75 acres as an undeveloped open space. Planning for the remainder of this park will involve recreational infrastructure, some of which may not be Stewardshipeligible. Maps are attached as Appendix A.

Current/prior use of property: Prior to the City's acquisition, there was no public use.

**Proposed public uses:** The proposed .75 acres of primarily wetland, will provide opportunities for passive recreation to include hiking, cross-country skiing, snowshoeing, fishing, nature watching, and will provide access to Lake Monona. Benches, picnic tables and a trail or walking path will be available. The property will be open to the public seven days per week, and 365 days per year. The Department's analysis of the permitted nature-based outdoor activities is attached in Appendix B.

**Property management:** The San Damiano property will be operated and maintained by the City of Monona Parks and Recreation Department, consistent with their management policy.

## II. NBOA DETERMINATION

Nature-based outdoor activities (NBOAs) are defined in s. NR 52.02(7), Wis. Adm. Code, as hunting, trapping, fishing, hiking, or cross-country skiing. The City of Monona ordinance prohibits hunting and trapping in City limits. DNR's Regional Public Safety Team, Nick Webster, Safety Specialist Warden, Jeremy Plautz, Regional Warden, and Cheryl Housley, Project Manager, determined that the prohibition

of these activities is necessary to protect public safety. This determination is based the following factors:

- The primary purpose of the project (public urban park).
- > City ordinances prohibit discharge and possession of weapon; use of bow and arrow in city park and trapping in a city park.
- > The location of the parcel in an urban setting.
- > Proximity to residential homes and schools.
- > State of Wisconsin hunting laws.
- ➤ Visitor expectation and likely user conflict if not prohibited.


State law prohibits the discharge of a firearm within 100 yards of any building devoted to human occupancy without the permission of the owner or occupant. State law also restricts both the possession and the discharge of firearms within 1,000 feet of school grounds as well as the hunting within 1,700 feet of any school grounds. The subject property is located within 1,000 feet of Frank Allis Elementary School and it is within 100 yards of several buildings devoted to human occupancy.


Given the urban nature of the property, it is likely that trapping at the site could cause user conflict.

The Department posted public notice about this determination on GovDelivery on November 9, 2021. Eight comments were received in support of the grant and prohibiting hunting and trapping, and one comment was a question of property location. A letter of support from a public official was also submitted in the comment period. The public notice and comment summary submitted may be found as Appendix C and D.

Project Description: City of Monona: San Damiano Acquisition - One of the last undeveloped pieces of land on Lake Monona. The site includes 9.8 acres. The grant request is for a sub-set of the property being 0.75 acres, and grant request is \$249,999. The overall 9-acre property is undeveloped land, much of it wooded, park-like setting with mowed turf and large trees, over 1,000 feet of shoreline with views of Downtown Madison skyline. The property has remnants of Native American encampments along the lakeshore which will remain untouched and highlighted. The property was next a farm developed in 1880's and then bequeathed to the priests of St. Norbert Abbey in 1929. Since then the land has primarily remained untouched.

The house and garage on the property are excluded from the grant, as they may remain due to historical significance.

City is embarking on its public planning process soon to address long-term public recreation and conservation purpose for this property.

## FINDINGS OF FACT:

The City of Monona is looking for Stewardship funding for the purpose of acquiring 0.75 acres of property along the east shore of the Lake Monona. This parcel is located north of residential housing, at the north end of 4123 Monona Drive, Monona WI 53716, west of Monona Drive and south of a stormwater outfall. The acquisition of this parcel would help provide a place for the public to hike, Fish, Picnic, Snowshoe, Cross-country ski, bike, watch/study nature/wildlife and a place to access the water for non-motorized boat usage (canoe, kayak).

This parcel equates to an unsymmetrical total area of roughly 110 feet wide by 290 feet long. The entire area is located within 300 feet of several private residences and businesses. Frank Allis Elementary School is well within 1,000 feet of the parcel.

This proximity to the school places the property boundary within a designated "school zone". State law restricts the use and possession of firearms as well as hunting within these designated school zones. As such, there are no legal options for hunting this parcel.

The SCR NBOA Public Safety Team has determined that the prohibition of hunting on this 0.75-acre parcel is necessary to stay in compliance with current state hunting laws, firearm discharge laws, state school zone laws and the need to protect the public's safety.

Parcel Size, Shape, and Topography: Describe the size, shape, and topography of the parcel and how it relates to public safety for this activity on this site.

The size of the subject property is 0.75 acres and is on the northern end of the 9-acre ownership and it includes frontage on the lake and a stormwater outlet. It is closer proximity (across Monona Drive & stormwater outfall) to residential housing ~165 feet. Likewise, it abuts Monona Drive for ~100 feet.

## **Public Safety Team Narrative:**

The high density of residential homes, businesses, and schools in the vicinity of the proposed property would make legal hunting impossible.

This 0.75-acre lot, of riverfront property is located entirely within the city limits of Monona, within 300 feet of several buildings devoted to human occupancy. State law prohibits the discharge of a firearm within 300 feet of any building devoted to human occupancy while on lands that you do not own, without the permission of the owner or occupant.

State law also restricts both the possession and the discharge of firearms within 1,000 feet of school grounds as well as the hunting within 1,700 feet of any school grounds. This 0.75-acre site is located entirely within 1,000 feet of Frank Allis Elementary.

The City of Monona has an ordinance which states that

- "No person shall use or shoot any bow and arrow in any City park, except in authorized areas, as permitted by the Parks and Recreation Director."
- "Firearms; hunting. Possessing or discharging of any air gun, slingshot, explosive, firearm or weapon
  of any kind is prohibited in all City parks."

The state law restrictions alone would eliminate the legal hunting on the entire 0.75 acres.

It is the opinion of SCR NBOA Public Safety Team the prohibition on all hunting is necessary to ensure compliance with current state firearm possession, firearm discharge and hunting laws. This will limit user conflict within the city and to ensure the safety of the public.

The City of Monona – San Damiano land acquisition Stewardship grant proposal was required to meet the Bureau's public notice policy (NR 52). The public notice was posted on GovDelivery on November 9, 2021, and the fifteen-day public review period ended on December 2, 2021.

The Department received eight (9) comments concerning this proposal which are summarize below:

Summary of comments:

General support comments (8): It is an outstanding parcel and a great fit for the Stewardship Program...

A once in a lifetime opportunity to preserve a unique piece of property that will benefit not only residents of the City of Monona and Dane County, but also... for people throughout the State.

This is a great use for these funds....I fully support the No Hunting requirement for this area.

This wonderful piece of nature that has gone largely untouched is the last of its kind along Lake Monona... continuing the protection of the property with no hunting, trapping, etc. is critical for the safety of animals and humans in the area, I support prohibiting such actions on the property as well.

The riparian nature of the site lends itself to intense use by the public for a wide variety of nature-based activities as well as outdoor recreation...It is wholly appropriate that this property not be open to hunting and trapping. It is surrounded by urban infrastructure of residences, commercial buildings, and public streets. Hunting would be dangerous, even with bow and arrow, and trapping would pose a risk to the public, particularly to curious children who might be exploring the shoreline.

# CITY OF MONONA SEEKS URBAN GREEN SPACE GRANT FOR LAND ACQUISITION

MADISON, Wis. – The Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources (DNR) today announced that the City of Monona has applied for a 50% matching grant from the Urban Green Space subprogram of the <u>Knowles-Nelson Stewardship Program</u> to assist with the purchase of .75-acres of land in the City of Monona in Dane County. The City will provide the matching funds to the grant award.

The City of Monona will acquire approximately .75 acres along Lake Monona to create a public park. In addition, the City is working on plans to eventually develop the site for outdoor recreation and public access on Lake Monona.

Recreational activities will include fishing, hiking, and cross-country skiing, picnicking and scenic enjoyment.

The DNR has examined the property's locational factors and is determining that the prohibition of hunting and trapping is necessary to protect public safety because of the parcel's proximity to roadways and residential dwellings.

The Knowles-Nelson Stewardship Fund was created in 1989 to preserve important natural resources, protect water quality and fisheries and expand opportunities for outdoor recreation for all Wisconsinites to enjoy.

On Stewardship-purchased land, nature-based outdoor activities (hunting, trapping, fishing, hiking or cross-country skiing) cannot be prohibited unless the DNR has determined that prohibiting one or more of those activities is justified to protect public safety.


